

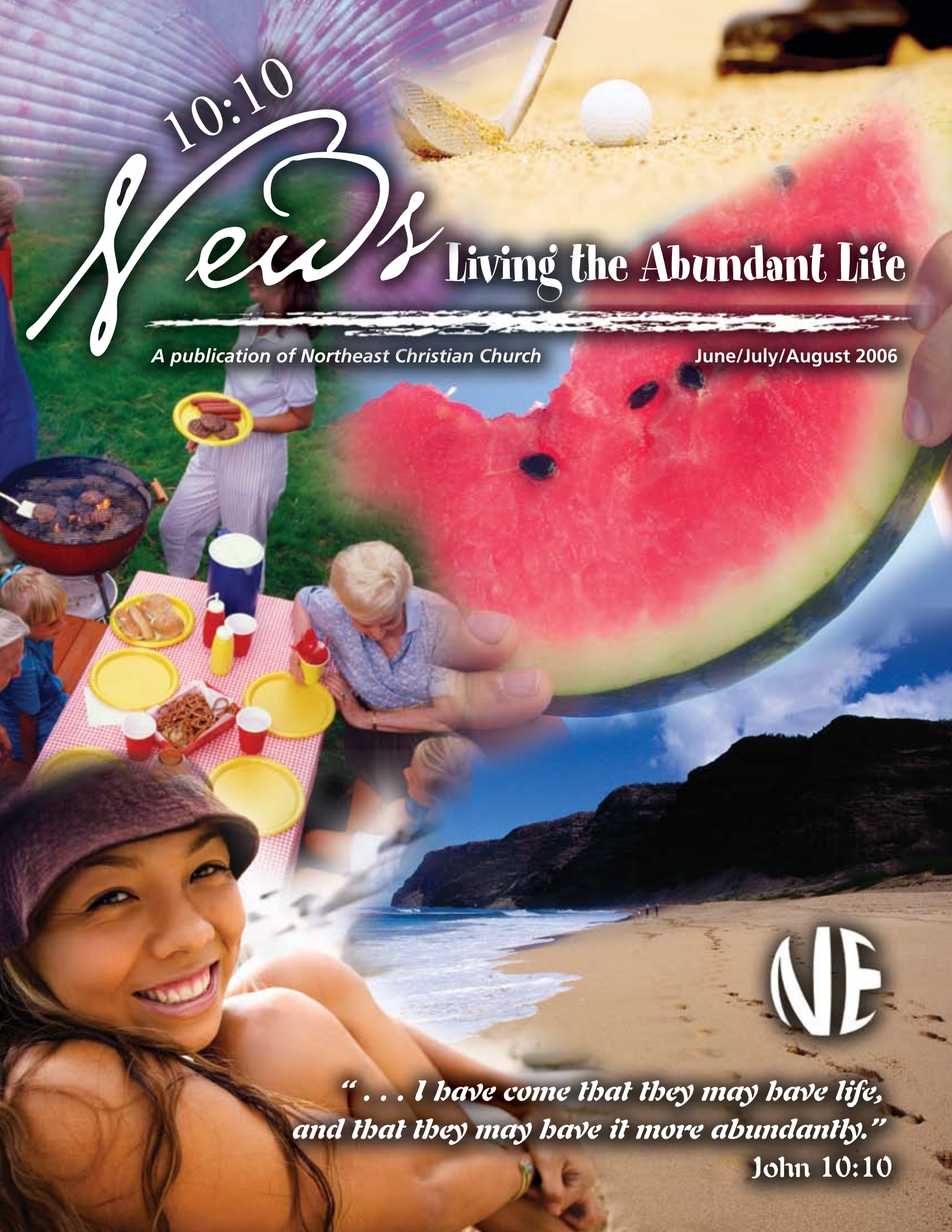

Northeast member Gregg Kramer is part of a motorcycle enthusiasts Life Group that prays together and rides together.

Motorcycles, tattoos, dark glasses, black leather jackets and chaps, black boots, long hair and beards – sounds like a Hells Angels meeting doesn't it?

Rather it's a Life Group at Northeast. That's right, every other Tuesday night a group of motorcycle enthusiasts get together to study God's word, pray for each other and ride their motorcycles.

Northeast member Gregg Kramer, along with Dave Rupp, Information Technology Director at Northeast, helped start the group.

"Dave and I were talking one day and thought this would be a great way to get into God's word and also ride our bikes," said Gregg. "It just kind of evolved into a Life Group."

Gregg says they usually have about 8-10 who meet at the church every other Tuesday. It's not always the same group of people though. "We've had about 12-16 different people show up since we've been meeting now for a couple months."

He says everyone in the group has "kind of taken ownership". They take any prayer requests and if someone wants to pray that's fine and "if someone doesn't that's fine too," says Gregg.

Born to Ride and Born Again!

After they study and pray they'll take a 20-30 mile bike ride. He says, "Sometimes we'll end up at a Dairy Queen or somewhere else. It's not the same place each night."

Gregg says he started riding motorcycles at about age 14 and has been riding ever since. "It was strictly rebellion and a way to irritate my parents," says Gregg. "There's something about having that sense of freedom and having the wind hit your face. It's just great," he adds.

Gregg doesn't even own a car. He said he rides his bike about 360 days a year. His wife Cora has a car, but he admits he rarely rides in it. "It's a good conversation starter," [not owning a car], says Gregg. "You should see some of the looks I get when it's a Tuesday morning in January and the temperature is in single digits. I'll admit there were times I'd rather be in a car," he added.

Gregg is also a member of an International organization called Bikers For Christ. It's an organization that has about 2,100 members with 25-30 in the Louisville area, each of whom is held accountable by his or her local church. Their mission, according to Gregg, is to serve Jesus and spread the Word being lead by the Holy Spirit.

FUNFACT! Gregg and Cora celebrated their fifth wedding anniversary on a 2001 motorcycle trip to the Ozarks.

They pulled over to the side of the road and renewed their vows in front of 20 other bikers!
