## Mary knew she would have to surrender her reputation.

### Mary knew she would have to surrender her safety.

Gabriel: "Your childhood is over. Your future is forfeited. Your reputation is finished. Your marriage may be through. You may not live past 14. But God has called you."

Mary: "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word."

Surrender is as counter-cultural as anything in the Modern West where self-autonomy, personal freedom, and individual rights are unquestioned values.

1. Surrender to Jesus is seen as a betrayal of your AUTHENTIC self.

"You are who you are! Follow your heart. Do whatever you feel. Live free. Be you. Don't conform, Resist! Society's standards! Your mom and dad! Your church! Political authority.

You do you."

1. Surrender to Jesus is seen as a betrayal of your AUTHENTIC self.

"I've got good news! Jesus says you can be saved into His kingdom where He exercises unquestioned universal authority over everything about you - your money, relationships, career, morality, sexuality, politics, rights, reputation, comfort, and dreams. Give it all to Him right now and forevermore. He rules. Take up your cross and die."

## 5. Surrender is hard with so much UNCERTAINTY and so many unanswered questions.

She knew He worked through unlikely characters and circumstances.

She knew that God protected women.

She knew His unquestioned authority.
