What are the four most effective ways to unleash  
Jesus' love at work?

1. Live at a holy pace.
2. Have spiritual conversations.

## Luke 15:1-10

Tax collectors and other notorious sinners often came to listen to Jesus teach. This made the Pharisees and teachers of religious law complain that He was associating with such sinful people—even eating with them! So Jesus told them this story: “If a man has a hundred sheep and one of them gets lost, what will he do? Won’t he leave the ninety-nine others in the wilderness and go to search for the one that is lost until he finds it?”

And when he has found it, he will joyfully carry it home on his shoulders. When he arrives, he will call together his friends and neighbors, saying, 'Rejoice with me because I have found my lost sheep.' In the same way, there is more joy in heaven over one lost sinner who repents and returns to God than over ninety-nine others who are righteous and haven't strayed away! "Or suppose a woman has ten silver coins and loses one. Won't she light a lamp and sweep the entire house and search carefully until she finds it?"

“And when she finds it, she will call in her friends and neighbors and say, ‘Rejoice with me because I have found my lost coin.’ In the same way, there is joy in the presence of God’s angels when even one sinner repents.”

Luke 15:1-10

In the same way, there is more joy in heaven over one lost sinner who repents and returns to God than over ninety-nine others who are righteous and haven't strayed away!

- Luke 7:36-50 - By allowing an immoral woman to serve Him.
- Luke 8:40-56 - Through a quick touch & fortune cookie blessing.
- Luke 9:10-17 - Let's do food trucks and feed 5000.
- Luke 10:1-12 - He trains and sends out others.
- Luke 13:10-17 - He breaks one of the 10 commandments.

- Luke 15 - Tells made-up stories.
- Luke 18:18-30 - Commands a rich person to sell everything.
- Luke 19:1-10 - Invites Himself over for dinner.
- Luke 19:45-48 - Starts a riot outside of church.
- Luke 20 - Flexes His theological wit.
- Luke 23:34 - Forgives His murderers.
- Luke 23:43 - Takes a man's deathbed confession.
- Luke 23:44-49 - He dies well.

- We are not afraid. (2Tim 1:7)
- We always hope. (Phil 1:6)

- We tear down racial and ethnic barriers (Eph 2:14)
- We believe in miracles (Mt 4:23-25)

- And we are the miracles (Eph 2:1-10)
- We have died to our old selves (Col 2:20)
- We have put on new clothes (Eph 4:24)
- We have new life, new motivation, new spiritual DNA (Rom 6:4)
