


THE POWER OF THE GOSPEL 1




A healthy church and a mature member think more about who they're trying to reach than who they're trying to keep.




"Gospel" - "Good News" euangelion - εὐαγγέλιον




Does anybody want me? The only reason you exist is because God wants you.

Justifiable Sin is necessary for the greater good


Blamable Sin is not your fault




The Holy Spirit & Sanctification






2 Timothy 1:9-10

For God saved us and called us to live a holy life. He did this, not because we deserved it, but because that was His plan from before the beginning of time—to show us His grace through Christ Jesus. And now He has made all of this plain to us by the appearing of Christ Jesus, our Savior. He broke the power of death and illuminated the way to life and immortality through the Good News [the Gospel].





Colossians 1:15-23 ... All the broken and dislocated pieces of the universe people and things, animals and atoms—get properly fixed and fit together in vibrant harmonies, all because of Jesus' death, His blood that poured down from the cross. You yourselves are a case study of what He does. At one time you all had your backs turned to God, thinking rebellious thoughts of Him, giving Him trouble every chance you got.





Colossians 1:15-23

But now, by giving Himself completely at the Cross, actually dying for you, Christ brought you over to God's side and put your lives together, whole and holy in His presence. You don't walk away from a gift like that! You stay grounded and steady in that bond of trust, constantly tuned in to the Gospel, careful not to be distracted or diverted. There is no other Gospel—just this one.
