

Ephesians 4:14-16




The American Experiment Narrative – The USA is an experiment in freedom and democracy ordained by God that must be spread around the world and defended with our lives.




The Militant Islamic Resurgence Narrative – Islam has awoken.





Surveillance Technology




“Even when a seismic event—a war, a technological leap, a free concert in the mud—plays an outsized role in shaping a group of young people, no single factor ever defines a generation. Parenting styles continue to change, as do school curricula and culture, and these things matter. But the twin rise of the smartphone and social media has caused an earthquake of a magnitude we’ve not seen in a very long time, if ever. There is compelling evidence that the devices we’ve placed in young people’s hands are having profound effects on their lives—and making them seriously unhappy.”

- iGen is experiencing the worst mental-health crisis in decades.
- 12th graders in 2015 were going out less often than eighth-graders as recently as 2009.
- Only 56% of high-school seniors in 2015 went out on dates; for Boomers and Xers, the number was 85 percent.
- Nearly all Boomer high-school students had their driver's license by senior year but more than one in four teens today still lack one at the end of high school.
- While they spend far more time under the same roof as their parents, today's teens are not closer to their parents than their predecessors.

- The number of teens who get together with friends nearly every day dropped by more than 40% from 2000 to 2015.
- Teens who spend more time than average on screen activities are more likely to be unhappy while those who spend more time than average on non-screen activities are more likely to be happy.
- 57% more teens were sleep deprived in 2015 than in 1991.
- In just the four years from 2012 to 2015, 22% more teens failed to get seven hours of sleep.



“If you were going to give advice for a happy adolescence based on [our data], it would be straightforward: Put down the phone, turn off the laptop, and do something that does not involve a screen.”
