Acts 1:8~9



I. Conversion

When we witness to the lost, we are empowered.

Acts 8:4~14

Samaritans & the Sorcerer

- Jesus wants the good news to go to Samaria.
 - No one wants to take it there.
- It takes a persecution to get Philip to go first.
- He witnesses to the lost – preaching & compassion.
 - Even famous sorcerer named Simon is saved.
- Peter & John pray, Samaritans receive Holy Spirit, validating legitimacy of their conversion.
- Simon tries to buy franchise rights to the Holy Spirit.
- Simon learns Holy Spirit empowers the witnesses, not the wealthy.

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Acts 8:18~24

Now when Simon saw that the Spirit was given through the laying on of the apostles' hands, he offered them money, saying, "Give me also this power so that anyone on whom I lay my hands may receive the Holy Spirit." But Peter said to him, "May your silver perish with you, because you thought you could obtain God's gift with money! You have no part or share in this, for your heart is not right before God. Repent therefore of this wickedness of yours, and pray to the Lord that, if possible, the intent of your heart may be forgiven you. For I see that you are in the gall of bitterness and the chains of wickedness." Simon answered, "Pray for me to the Lord, that nothing of what you have said may happen to me."

II. Multi-Ethnic Inclusion

When we witness across lines of prejudice, we are empowered.

Acts 1

Spirit empowers commission to Multi-Ethnic Witness.

Acts 1:8 – But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And you will be My witnesses, telling people about Me **everywhere**—in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.

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Acts 2

Spirit births Multi-Ethnic Church at Pentecost.

Acts 2:5-12 – At that time there were devout Jews from every nation living in Jerusalem. When they heard the loud noise, everyone came running, and they were bewildered to hear their own languages being spoken by the believers. They were completely amazed. “How can this be?” they exclaimed. “These people are all from Galilee, and yet we hear them speaking in our own native languages!”

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Acts 2

Spirit births Multi-Ethnic Church at Pentecost.

“Here we are—Parthians, Medes, Elamites, people from Mesopotamia, Judea, Cappadocia, Pontus, the province of Asia, Phrygia, Pamphylia, Egypt, and the areas of Libya around Cyrene, visitors from Rome (both Jews and converts to Judaism), Cretans, and Arabs. And we all hear these people speaking in our own languages about the wonderful things God has done!”
They stood there amazed and perplexed. “What can this mean?”
they asked each other.

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Acts 2:16~17

Acts 6 – Diverse Leaders, Full of the Spirit, Selected.

Acts 16 – Spirit compels Paul to witness in Macedonia.

**Acts 28 – Paul confirms Spirit's desire for God's
salvation to go to Gentiles.**



III. Encouragement

When we face hard times or persecution for our witness,
we are empowered.

Acts 20:22~24

“And now, as a captive to the Spirit, I am on my way to Jerusalem, not knowing what will happen to me there, except that the Holy Spirit testifies to me in every city that imprisonment and persecutions are waiting for me. But I do not count my life of any value to myself, if only I may finish my course and the ministry that I received from the Lord Jesus, to testify to the good news of God’s grace.”

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Acts 21:30~40

Paul was grabbed and dragged out of the Temple, and immediately the gates were closed behind him. As they were trying to kill him, word reached the commander of the Roman regiment that all Jerusalem was in an uproar. He immediately called out his soldiers and officers and ran down among the crowd. When the mob saw the commander and the troops coming, they stopped beating Paul. Then the commander arrested him and ordered him bound with two chains. He asked the crowd who he was and what he had done. Some shouted one thing and some another. Since he couldn't find out the truth in all the uproar and confusion, he ordered that Paul be taken to the fortress.

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Acts 21:30~40

As Paul reached the stairs, the mob grew so violent the soldiers had to lift him to their shoulders to protect him. And the crowd followed behind, shouting, “Kill him, kill him!” As Paul was about to be taken inside, he said to the commander, “May I have a word with you?”

“Do you know Greek?” the commander asked, surprised.

“Aren’t you the Egyptian who led a rebellion some time ago and took 4,000 members of the Assassins out into the desert?”

“No,” Paul replied, “I am a Jew and a citizen of Tarsus in Cilicia, which is an important city. Please, let me talk to these people.”

Meanwhile the church throughout Judea, Galilee, and Samaria had peace and was built up. Living in the fear of the Lord and in the comfort of the Holy Spirit, it increased in numbers.

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IV. Guidance

When we seek His direction, we are empowered.

Acts 16:6~12

They went through the region of Phrygia and Galatia, having been **forbidden** by the Holy Spirit to speak the word in Asia. When they had come opposite Mysia, they attempted to go into Bithynia, but the Spirit of Jesus **did not allow them**; so, passing by Mysia, they went down to Troas.

During the night Paul had a vision: there stood a man of Macedonia pleading with him and saying, “Come over to Macedonia and help us.” When he had seen the vision, **we** immediately tried to cross over to Macedonia, being convinced that God had called **us** to proclaim the good news to them.

V. Supernatural Gifts

Acts 4:8 – Peter preaches beyond his stature and education.

Acts 4:31 – The Church preached w/ supernatural courage.

Acts 5:1-11 – Peter discerned beyond what he knew.

**Acts 6:10 – Stephen spoke and persuaded with
impenetrable wisdom.**

**Acts 11:28 – Agabus given supernatural
foresight about a famine.**

Acts 13:9-12 – Paul blinds an enemy sorcerer.

Acts 4:13

Proof That Political Privilege Is Harmful for Christianity

Our analysis of 166 nations suggests the biggest threat to Christian vitality is not persecution, affluence, education, or pluralism. It's state support.

- Analyzed global sample of 166 countries from 2010 to 2020.
 - The biggest threat to Christian vitality is not persecution, affluence, education, or pluralism.
 - It is the extent to which governments give official support through laws and policies.
 - 9 of the 10 countries w/ the fastest declining Christian populations offer moderate to high levels of official support for Christianity.

- The presence of pluralism and absence of privilege means Christianity must be chosen for its actual merits and spiritual power rather than its social merits and political power.
 - There is no such thing as lukewarm Christianity when it may cost you welfare, prison, or worse.

“Our research suggests the best way for Christian communities to recover their gospel witness is to reject the quest for political privilege as inconsistent with the teachings of Jesus. In doing so, they would show that they take seriously Christ’s promise that no force will be able to prevail against His church. And rejecting privilege will make believers more reliant on the Holy Spirit to open hearts to the gospel message.”
