Job 14:14

Job asked: “When a Man dies, can he Live again?”

Hebrews 9:27

It is appointed for Man to die once, and after that comes Judgment.



John 11:1-3

Now a man named Lazarus was sick. He lived in Bethany with his two sisters, Mary and Martha. (This Mary was the same one who later anointed the Lord with ointment and wiped His feet with her hair).

John 11:1-3

So the sisters sent word to Jesus, saying, “Lord, the one You love is sick.”

John 11:4

But when Jesus heard it, He said, "This illness does not lead to death. Rather it is for the Glory of God, so that the Son of God may be glorified through it."

John 11:11-15

Then Jesus said, "Our friend Lazarus has fallen asleep; but I am going there to wake him up."

John 11:11-15

His Disciples replied, "Lord, if he sleeps, he will get better."

John 11:11-15

Jesus had been speaking of his Death, but His Disciples thought He meant natural sleep. So then Jesus told them plainly, "Lazarus is dead, but for your sake I am glad I was not there, so that you may believe. Now let us go to him."

John 11:17-19

On his arrival, Jesus found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days.

John 11:17-19

Now Bethany was less than two miles from Jerusalem, and many Jews had come to Martha and Mary to comfort them in the loss of their brother.

John 11:20-22

When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she ran out to meet Him, but Mary stayed at home.

John 11:20-22

“Lord,” Martha said to Jesus, “if You had been here, my brother would not have died. But I know that even now God will give You whatever You ask.”

John 11:23-24

Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again."
Martha answered, "I know he will rise again in the resurrection at the last day."

John 11:25-27

Jesus said to her, "I am the Resurrection and the Life. Whoever believes in Me, though he dies, yet shall he live, and everyone who lives and believes in Me shall never die. Do you believe this?"

John 11:28-32

When she had said this, she went and called her sister Mary, saying in private, "The Teacher is here and is calling for you." And when she heard it, she rose quickly and went to Him.

John 11:28-32

Now when Mary came to where Jesus was and saw Him, she fell at His feet, saying, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died."

John 11:33-36

When Jesus saw Mary weeping, and the Jews who had come with her also weeping, He was deeply moved in his spirit and greatly troubled. And He said, "Where have you laid him?"

John 11:33-36

They said to Him, “Lord, come and see.”

Jesus wept. So the Jews said, “See how He loved him!”

John 11:38-39

Jesus, once more deeply moved, came to the tomb. It was a cave with a stone laid across the entrance.

John 11:38-39

“Take away the stone,” he said.

“But, Lord,” said Martha, “by this time there is a bad odor, for he has been there four days.”

John 11:40-42

Jesus said to her, “Did I not tell you that if you believed you would see the Glory of God?”

John 11:40-42


So they took away the stone. And Jesus lifted up His eyes and said, "Father, I thank You that You have heard Me. I knew that You always hear Me, but I said this on account of the people standing around, that they may believe that You sent Me."

John 11:43-44

When He had said these things, He cried out with a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out."

John 11:43-44

The man who had died came out, his hands and feet bound with linen strips, and his face wrapped with a cloth. Jesus said to them, “Unbind him, and let him go.”
