Q: What is going on with Revelation?

1. Ignorers

They see Revelation as a frustrating, embarrassing, unsolvable enigma.

So, they never read it.

2. Obsessers

They are certain they have decoded Revelation

So, they read everything through it.

Q: What verse does Revelation talk about the rapture?

Matthew 24:36

However, no one knows the day or hour when these things will happen, not even the angels in heaven or the Son himself. Only the Father knows.

Revelation 1:1-4

This is a revelation from Jesus Christ, which God gave Him to show His servants the events that must soon take place. He sent an angel to present this revelation to His servant John, who faithfully reported everything he saw. This is his report of the word of God and the testimony of Jesus Christ. God blesses the one who reads the words of this prophecy to the church, and He blesses all who listen to its message and obey what it says, for the time is near. This letter is from John to the seven churches in the province of Asia.



- -Don't let the dragon and his minions compromise your church!
- -John paints a picture of the epic battle between good and evil that was (and is) happening right now.
- -It's fought in the physical world that we can see and the spiritual world that we can't.
- -The battle is between Team Dragon vs. Team Lamb.
- -The outcome has already been decided! Team Lamb wins!
- -So, don't let the dragon and his minions seduce you!

- -Revelation falls more in the genre of epic fantasy.
- -Team Dragon is behind all the evil.
- -Team Lamb is behind all the good.
- -Team Dragon has a warfare strategy violence, deception, dominance, coercive power.
- -Team Lamb has a warfare strategy crossshaped self-sacrificial love, truth of the gospel, faithful perseverance.
- -Team Lamb will win! Trust me!

Prophetic Literature

- Prophets are NOT primarily future-tellers
- Use lots of poetry and evocative imagery
- More harmonic than chronological
- Expect you to know the baseline story of Scripture up to that point
- Three big prophetic themes: (1) Call out sin; (2) Call for repentance; (3) Pronounce judgment/hope.

Q: What's up with the seven seals, bowls, and trumpets?

Revelation 6:9-11

When the Lamb broke the fifth seal, I saw under the altar the souls of all who had been martyred for the word of God and for being faithful in their testimony. They shouted to the Lord and said, "O Sovereign Lord, holy and true, how long before You judge the people who belong to this world and avenge our blood for what they have done to us?" Then a white robe was given to each of them. And they were told to rest a little longer until the full number of their brothers and sisters —their fellow servants of Jesus who were to be martyred—had joined them.

Revelation 9:20-21

But the people who did not die in these plagues still refused to repent of their evil deeds and turn to God. They continued to worship demons and idols made of gold, silver, bronze, stone, and wood—idols that can neither see nor hear nor walk! And they did not repent of their murders or their witchcraft or their sexual immorality or their thefts.

Letter < Prophecy < Apocalypse

- 1:1 This is a revelation from Jesus Christ
- 1:1 Άποκάλυψις Ίησοῦ Χριστοῦ

Apokalypsis

- to reveal; to disclose; to unveil; to pull the curtains back on reality
- 1:1 This is an "unveiling of reality" from Jesus Christ
- Apocalyptic Literature was popular among Jews and Christians from 200BC to 200AD.
- Book of Enoch, Apocalypse of Abraham, Apocalypse of Adam, Apocalypse of Elijah, 2 & 3 Baruch, 2 Esdras (or 4 Ezra), Apocalypse of Peter, Revelation.
- We have to learn the rules of this style.

Revelation 17:3-6

So the angel took me in the Spirit into the wilderness. There I saw a woman sitting on a scarlet beast that had seven heads and ten horns, and blasphemies against God were written all over it. The woman wore purple and scarlet clothing and beautiful jewelry made of gold and precious gems and pearls. In her hand she held a gold goblet full of obscenities and the impurities of her immorality.

Revelation 17:3-6

A mysterious name was written on her forehead: "Babylon the Great, Mother of All Prostitutes and Obscenities in the World." I could see that she was drunk—drunk with the blood of God's holy people who were witnesses for Jesus. I stared at her in complete amazement.

Rev 17:9 - This calls for a mind with understanding: The seven heads of the beast represent the seven hills where the woman rules.

Rev 17:18 - And this woman you saw in your vision represents the great city that rules over the kings of the world.

Interpretive Key

Revelation was a prophetic letter written to seven ancient churches in apocalyptis style about how to persevere suffering and resist compromise in a Roman Empire animated by Satan.

Revelation 21:4

"He will wipe every tear from their eyes, and there will be no more death or sorrow or crying or pain. All these things are gone forever."

Mark of Beast

14:16 – "[The Beast] required everyone ... to be given a mark on the right hand or on the forehead. And no one could buy or sell anything without that mark"

Mark of the Lamb

14:1,4 - "Then I saw the Lamb standing on Mt. Zion, and with him were 144,000 who had His name and His Father's name written on their foreheads ... They have kept themselves as pure as virgins, following the Lamb wherever He goes."

Where has Babylon seeped into your church and your life?

WWBD or WWJD?

Revelation 7:9-10

After this I saw a vast crowd, too great to count, from every nation and tribe and people and language, standing in front of the throne and before the Lamb.
