## Galatians 1:1-10

This letter is from Paul, an apostle. I was not appointed by any group of people or any human authority, but by Jesus Christ Himself and by God the Father, who raised Jesus from the dead. All the brothers and sisters here join me in sending this letter to the churches of Galatia. May God the Father and our Lord Jesus Christ give you grace and peace. Jesus gave His life for our sins, just as God our Father planned, in order to rescue us from this evil world in which we live. All glory to God forever and ever! Amen.

## Galatians 1:1-10

I am shocked that you are turning away so soon from God, who called you to Himself through the loving mercy of Christ. You are following a different way that pretends to be the Good News but is not the Good News at all. You are being fooled by those who deliberately twist the truth concerning Christ. Let God's curse fall on anyone, including us or even an angel from heaven, who preaches a different kind of Good News than the one we preached to you.

## Galatians 1:1-10

I say again what we have said before: If anyone preaches any other Good News than the one you welcomed, let that person be cursed. Obviously, I'm not trying to win the approval of people, but of God. If pleasing people were my goal, I would not be Christ's servant.

#### Interpretive Key for Galatians

- Literary Type: theologically dense letter
- Author: Paul, formerly Saul or Tarsus
- Recipient: a network of churches planted by Paul in Galatia
- Problem: some very influential false-teachers from within Christianity have undermined Paul's gospel to the gentiles by adding Torah-allegiance on top of faith in Jesus (Jesus + Torah)
- Tone: fiery and frustrated
- Stakes: a potential split into two denominations
- Outline:
- a. defends the (Jesus + nothing) gospel He preached, (ch.1-2)
- **b.** explains how this gospel creates a multi-ethnic (Jew + gentile) family whose core identity is in Christ, (ch.3-4)
- **c.** demonstrates how this gospel produces freedom from sin through the Spirit's leadership (not Torah) (ch.5-6).

GALATIANS 1:9

If anyone preaches any other Good News than the one you welcomed, let that person be cursed [ἀνάθεμα ἔστω].

# Deconstructing the Same Beliefs

## I. "I'm too smart to believe in..."

-the reliability of the Bible, miracles, a literal resurrection, the divinity of Jesus ("he's just a really nice teacher"), really anything supernatural

## 2. "I'm too kind to believe in..."

-a literal hell, biblical sex ethics and gender codes, atonement theories, or the exclusivity of Jesus ("he's not the only way to God")



This letter is from Paul, an <u>apostle</u>. I was not <u>appointed</u> **by** any group of people or any human authority, but by Jesus Christ himself and by God the Father, who raised Jesus from the dead.

The Bible didn't fall from the sky in a golden beam, leatherbound, with journaling margins and KJV English, while angels sang a heavenly chord. So, how was it determined what made it in the NT?

Criteria #1 - Was it written by or directly associated with an Apostle of Jesus?

Paul also wrote to you with the wisdom God gave him—speaking of these things in all of his letters. Some of his comments are hard to understand, and those who are ignorant and unstable have twisted his letters to mean something quite different, just as they do with other parts of Scripture. And this will result in their destruction.

#### 1 TIMOTHY 5:18

For the Scripture says, "You must not muzzle an ox to keep it from eating as it treads out the grain." [Dt 25:4] And in another place, "Those who work deserve their pay!" [Lk 10:7]

ACTS 2:42

All the believers devoted themselves to the (1) <u>apostles'</u> <u>teaching</u>, and to (2) fellowship, and to (3) sharing in meals (including the Lord's Supper), and to (4) prayer.
