Ecclesiastes Review

- -The book was written by one old man ("Pops") quoting another old man ("Solomon") to teach his son ("the youths") wisdom.
- -Pop's goal? Use the wisdom of Solomon to teach his son how to live a life of meaning.
- -King Solomon was a historical legend and cultural icon.
- -Message? You need God! All the things we look to for meaning never satisfy us apart from God.

Ecclesiastes 1:1-3

These are the words of the Teacher, King David's son, who ruled in Jerusalem. "Everything is meaningless," says the Teacher, "completely meaningless!" What do people get for all their hard work under the sun?

Principles of Wisdom for a Meaningful Life

- 1. Without a God above the sun, all the good things under the sun are like vapor.
- 2. Learn to enjoy the simple good things of life as gifts of God.
- 3. Life is hard. Then you die. Deal with it.

Ecclesiastes 3:16-4:3

I also noticed that under the sun there is evil in the courtroom. Yes, even the courts of law are corrupt! I said to myself, "In due season God will judge everyone, both good and bad, for all their deeds." I also thought about the human condition—how God proves to people that they are like animals. For people and animals share the same fate —both breathe and both must die. So people have no real advantage over the animals. How meaningless! Both go to the same place—they came from dust and they return to dust. For who can prove that the human spirit goes up and the spirit of animals goes down into the earth? So I saw that there is nothing better for people than to be happy in their work. That is our lot in life. And no one can bring us back to see what happens after we die.

Ecclesiastes 3:16-4:3

Again, I observed all the oppression that takes place under the sun. I saw the tears of the oppressed, with no one to comfort them. The oppressors have great power, and their victims are helpless. So I concluded that the dead are better off than the living. But most fortunate of all are those who are not yet born. For they have not seen all the evil that is done under the sun.

Christianity teaches that God didn't cause evil, but He is actively working against it for you.

- -God is not evil. He is holy and love.
- -God created human beings (and spiritual beings) to share that love.
- -For love to be possible, God had to give us the freedom to choose it.
- -Our freedom to choose love must also freedom not to.
- -Therefore, God never causes evil.
- -Rather than using his power to take our freewill before it goes bad, God uses His power to defeat our free-will after it goes bad.
- -This process cultivates virtues in us like contentment (Jms 1:2), resilience (Jms 1:3) and wisdom (Jms 1:5).

Romans 8:28

And we know that God causes everything to work together for the good of those who love God and are called according to His purpose for them.
