BIG IDEA

OPENING QUESTION

Share how the Love the 'Ville movement has impacted you in the last 10 years?

GROUP DISCUSSION

- Read this passage: Revelation 5:11-14. Twice out loud, in different versions of the Bible – everyone listens.
- What are some significant observations you have about this text? What stood out? What didn't you like? What was confusing?
- What does this passage teach us about God? How does it change how I see God?
- What does this passage teach us about humanity/ourselves? How would it change how I treat others?
- What does this passage teach us about obedience and following the way of Jesus? How should it affect the way I live?

WEEKEND

Thought:

In the book of Revelation, we are given a powerful vision of people from every nation, tribe, and language gathered before God in worship. While multiculturalism has become a popular cultural value in the West in recent decades, the vision presented in Revelation is far more profound. Its beauty lies not merely in its inclusivity or human-centered harmony, but in the fact that all people are united in the worship of God. This is not about finding common ground through human effort; it is about discovering higher ground—shared by all who recognize their need for redemption and find it in Jesus.

John also records a conversation Jesus had with a foreigner.

Read: John 4:22–23

If the passage is unfamiliar to anyone, then read the surrounding context.

Questions:

How do you see both the compassion and the correction of Jesus in this passage?

How does Jesus look like someone full of grace in this conversation?

How do you see Jesus expanding his kingdom?
